## **Registration Fee: \$95**

## Tuition (2024-2025) per semester:

- Full-time Day = \$8,340 (12-24 hours of technical and general education classes; \$695 per credit hour)
- Part-time Evening = \$4,170 (6 hours of technical education; \$695 per credit hour) .
- General Education only = \$573 per 3 credit hour class •
- BSAM Education only = \$1,182 per 3 credit hour class

## Fees (2024-2025) per semester:

- Full-time Day = \$664 Student Fee
- Part-time Evening = \$335 Student Fee .
- General Education only = \$335 Student Fee
- Diesel (Perryville) = \$2,201.50
- Automotive (Wentzville) = \$1,531
- Lap Tops are required for some programs and can be leased from the college if desired -- \$600 per semester
- Testing Fee Automotive \$103 (All Day programs St. Louis & Wentzville), Professional Collision Repair \$158 (All Day & Evening programs), Information Technology \$206 (Day programs), Information Technology \$134 (Evening programs), Advanced Precision Machining \$124 (Day programs), Precision Machining \$52 (Evening programs), Fabrication & Welding \$185 (Day program), Fabrication & Welding \$124 (Evening), Industrial Engineering Technology \$52, Automotive \$458 (St. Louis evening ACR and AMT), Automotive High Performance \$664 (St. Louis full-time evening), Plumbing \$110 (day and evening, 1<sup>st</sup> semester), Carpentry \$110 (day and evening, 1<sup>st</sup> semester).

#### Estimated Books/Tools per semester:

- Books = \$131-\$800 (depending on program) ٠
- Tools = \$125-\$4,600 (for the initial first semester tool kit depending on program)

#### \*Tool costs vary greatly by program. Most programs require an initial tool kit (estimated cost above); however, may require additional tools in subsequent semesters.

#### Estimated Cost of Living (Room/Board, Transportation & Personal Expenses) per semester:

- Room/Board = \$7,125.
- Transportation = \$1,451٠
- Personal/Misc. = \$4,619 .

#### \*The above Cost of Living amounts are based on figures provided by The College Board – Moderate (Prevailing) Budgets. These are also Indirect Costs and are not charged to your student billing but are used to calculate the Cost of Attendance.

### Financial Aid:

- Pell Grant awards vary from \$767 \$7,395 per academic year based on your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined by the FAFSA & enrollment status.
- SEOG awards of \$500 may be available to students with a zero EFC (who are full-time) until the funds are exhausted.
- Student loans are available to students to assist with educational expenses. Students should borrow responsibly and only . what is needed. Students may borrow (if eligible), between \$5,500 to \$10,500 per year, depending on grade level in school and dependency status. Student loans plus interest must be repaid. Use My Federal Student Aid account (https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/sign-in/landing) to find out how much you owe in federal loans.

#### **Registration:**

- Student is pre-registered in all required courses required for graduation upon admission to the college. ٠
- Subsequent registration changes must be initiated in the Registrar's Office or Student Success Department.
- **Courses that CANNOT be certified:** Remedial courses and Continuing Education courses.
